The Centennial Theatre Department is asking for help from the Centennial District Paras, Administration, community and staff to help with our new program, **Apeiron On Stage**

- Our goal is to produce a theatrical production every year, launching in winter 2025
- Gives the opportunity of theatre performance for any special education student who has any level of physical challenges or abilities.

Students participating in the program will be teamed up with students in the theater program, **"Apeiron Companions"**, who will be with them through the process of rehearsal and performance and cultivating their potential to tell beautiful stories on the stage.

This program is open to students at the High School level in our community.

We will be partnering with the "Unlabeled Theater Company", a leader in the Twin Cities theater community providing theater opportunities for adults with disabilities. They have reached out to us and want to support us with all their resources to help us succeed, and mentor and guide us through this process.

Rehearsals will be less than an hour to accommodate the needs of our students. Our goal is to hold the rehearsals in the PAC during LEAP hour, during the school day.

Theater Students who are **"Apeiron Companions"** will receive an automatic letter in theater.

Centennial Theater Booster Vice-President Brandy Eckman will be using her experience in this field to be the manager of the program providing administration, fundraising, and communication with the families.

Centennial Theater Director Eric Webster will lead the Directing and Production team for the program.

We will be raising money through donations or sponsorship for this program so **there is no charge for participants and their families.**

This program will be self-sufficient with no cost or monetary support needed from the district.
